The Town of Luray is located at the crossroads of major routes of travel, approximately 90 miles west of Washington D.C. and 45 miles south of Winchester. Interstate 81 is located just 15 miles to the west; and Interstate 66 is just 25 miles to the north.

The Town of Luray was established by act of General Assembly on February 6, 1812 on ten acres of land near Hawksbill Creek. Today, the growth of Luray continues to be fueled by its prime location: the ideal balance between rural scenery and travel connection. 

Nestled between the Blue Ridge and the Massanutten Mountain Ranges in the Shenandoah Valley, Luray welcomes you home.

Services – The Town offers you exceptional government services that include law enforcement, street maintenance, utilities, and recreation. Please visit Town Hall to establish new water and sewer utility service at your residence and confirm garbage collection information and our free recycling program. In addition, please contact the Town prior to undertaking any improvements to your home or property so that we can ensure it complies with our development standards. For questions about Town services, please call (540) 743-5511. If you experience a water outage after hours, please call (540) 743-6571.

Outdoor Fun – As a new resident, we encourage you to visit all of the Town’s parks, as well as the recreational opportunities that are available around our area. **Lake Arrowhead** is a 134-acre recreational area that offers fishing, hiking, non-motorized boating, recreation fields, playgrounds, and the best beach this side of the Blue Ridge Mountains. Lake Arrowhead is located on the east side of Town at 265 Lake Arrowhead Road. You can also visit our nationally recognized **Ralph H. Dean Park** that offers a huge playground, a skate park, a frisbee golf course, a 20-station fitness trail, football and soccer fields and world class baseball and softball fields. Ralph H. Dean Park is located on the southeast side of Town at 625 Sixth Street. Please enjoy our 2-mile **Hawksbill Greenway** that runs through the heart of the Town along Hawksbill Creek. The Greenway runs from the south end of Town to just beyond our northern end across from Bulldog Field on US Route 340. Parking is located at various locations adjacent to the Greenway throughout **Ruffner Plaza** is the perfect area to enjoy a quiet moment from the serenity of the Hawksbill Creek. **Cave Pond** is also a great place to enjoy a picnic where you can walk around the **Luray Singing Tower**.
