### PUBLIC NOTICE

June 9, 2020

At their June 8, 2020 Council Meeting, the Luray Town Council reviewed the following issues and took the following actions.

Under the Roll Call item:

All members were present with Councilman Joey Sours attending electronically.

Under the Continuity of Government Announcement:

- 1) Mayor Presgraves announced that the meeting was conducted pursuant to the April 13, 2020 Ordinance for Continuity in the Government of Luray with the public providing input and comment through contact to the Town Manager prior to the meeting

Under the Consent Agenda item:

- 1) Council unanimously approved minutes from the May 11<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting, the Accounts Payable checks, and the May financial statements.

Under the Citizen Comments agenda item:

- 1) Chris Hurlburt of 161 South Lawyer Drive, Stanley VA submitted a letter requesting Council to consider removal of the monument on South Broad Street and on Reservoir Avenue
- 2) George Barbee of PO Box 387, Captiva Island FL submitted a letter requesting the should the monument on Reservoir Avenue be stored that his family as descendants of the sculpture be permitted to store the sculpture.

Under the Action & Discussion agenda item:

- 1) Town Council unanimously approved the FY 2020-2021 Town Budget of \$11,704,308 comprised of \$5,875,290 for General Fund, \$700,000 for the Community Development Block Grant for Luray Meadows Apartments, \$1,482,616 for Water Fund, and \$3,646,402 for Sewer Fund.
- 2) Town Council unanimously adopted the Ordinance for the FY 2020-2021 Rates and Fees Schedule effective July 1, 2020. Council adopted a reduced Septage Disposal Fee of \$400.00 per 1,000 gallons based upon the full tank volume of the septage truck unless a digital meter based on a tank float is available.
- 3) Town Council unanimously approved the Resolution approving the issuance of a five-year, \$131,157.68 Non-Tax Exempt General Obligation Bond to refinance the outstanding debt for improvement made at Ralph H. Dean Park.
- 4) Town Council referred a Code Amendment to allow accessory dwelling units in the R-2 Medium Density Residential Zoning District by Special Permit provided that the accessory dwelling unit is located on the same parcel as the main building and that independent utility connections are made by a vote of 5-1 with Councilman Lancaster voting no.
- 5) Town Council unanimously recommended William Fisher to the Judge of the Page County Circuit Court for re-appointment to the Town of Luray Board of Zoning Appeals to serve a five-year term ending June 30, 2025.



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- 6) Town Council unanimously approved an amendment to the Ordinance Providing for Continuity in the Government of Luray adopted April 13, 2020 to all public participation in Town public meeting in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order. The public will be allowed at Town meetings beginning June 22<sup>nd</sup> as long as masks are worn and attendance is limited to twenty-two visitors.
