

Welcome to Luray



Lake Arrowhead is the focal point of the 134 acre Lake Arrowhead Park Recreation Area. The park is owned and operated by the Town of Luray, maintained by the Parks and Recreation Department, and is located 3 miles outside of Luray town limits. Built in the early 1970's, the park was originally constructed as a flood control dam which features a 39 acre lake, and offers fishing and non-motorized boating as well as a white sand beach and concession stand that is open from Memorial Day to Labor Day. The park includes a one-mile hiking trail that takes visitors through wooded areas and circles the entire lake. There are 6 picnic shelters with charcoal grills and electric available for rent throughout the year. The Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries manages the lake fishery. Gradually sloping banks, relatively clear water, and a maximum depth of 43 feet best describes the physical makeup of the lake. The lake basin was cleared of all structures during construction making underwater structures sparse. Local fishing enthusiasts have been active in adding brush fish attractors to the lake. Lake Arrowhead features a pan fish population including largemouth bass, walleye, northern pike, crappie, bluegill/redear sunfish, and channel catfish. Anglers have the opportunity to fish by boat or from the shore. Boat access includes a concrete boat ramp and boat dock.

LAKE ARROWHEAD FISHING REGULATIONS:

In addition to a valid Virginia Freshwater Fishing License, person's 16 years of age or older are required to have a Town of Luray Lake Arrowhead Fishing and Boating Permit which is available at the Luray Town Office, Fairview Grocery, and Wal-Mart. Please note, the use of gasoline boat motors is prohibited. Electric trolling motors are welcome.

Largemouth Bass – 5 per day, all bass 11-16 inches must be released
Bluegill/Redear Sunfish – 50 per day in aggregate, no minimum size limit
Crappie – 25 per day, no minimum size limit
Northern Pike – 2 per day, all northern pike less than 20 inches must be released
Channel Catfish – 20 per day, no minimum size limit
